Course Description

The book of Romans is critical to the understanding of salvation and sanctification. Students will explore the rich truths of justification and other significant topics by completing an exegetical and theological study of Paul's Epistle to the Romans. Students will be encouraged to put these textual theories into practical living.

Course Objective

- Gain a deeper understanding of salvation and sanctification
- Be able to discuss in detail Paul's desire to meet a Church that he did not start, but encouraged.
- Wrestle with selected theological issues and formulate and understanding of the issue.
